Saint Nicholas of Patara who resided and served as a bishop in ancient Myra inspired the tradition of Santa Claus. Aspendos is considered to be the best-preserved theatre of antiquity. Termessos, Olympos, Aspendos, Perge, and Myra ancient cities are some of the other must-visit historical spots along the Turkish Riviera. Moreover, Xanthos-Letoon, the Mediterranean's hidden gem is a UNESCO World Heritage Site that deserves to be on your itinerary. A great addition after visiting these sites will be the awarded Museum of Archeology in Antalya with its vast collection.

The region is a paradise for adventurers who enjoy caving, camping, and biking in and around stunning waterfalls and pine forests. Damlataş cave and Dim cave awaits caving enthusiasts, while the Lycian Way that stretches over 500 kilometers combines the endless blue of the sea with lush pine forests, bringing nature and sports enthusiasts together to discover unique landscapes and ancient Lycian cities that bear traces of the past.

Side, the most important port city of ancient Pamphylia is adorned with breathtaking monuments and pomegranate trees that gave Side its name. The majestic temple to Apollo looking out over the Mediterranean is a picturesque site to visit.

The Pisidian Trail is also a long-distance trail walking route with several archaeological sites along the way, continuing up in the Taurus highlands. With all of their splendor, both upper and lower Düden Waterfalls, one of Antalya's magnificent attractions, create a picturesque natural spectacle.

When sea beckons, consider hopping on a yacht or a gulet –a traditional two-masted wooden sailing boat – to explore pristine coves from Fethiye to Antalya encircled by lush green forests. The Turkish Riviera is the ideal location for a Blue Voyage.
